Non-uniform Day Friday 10th February


The Friday before half term is a non-uniform day. The charity chosen is Devon Air Ambulance

Nursery


If you are thinking of using the school nursery in September it would be helpful if an expression of interest form could be filled so we are aware of future numbers. Please come and get a form from the school office.
